# CATCHES ARE UP AT TULCHAN

Spey catches are up - with a 27% increase on the 10 year average and 2008 recording highest catch levels since 1994, according to the Spey Board. Tulchan Water is no exception. Careful river management, the introduction of the new hatchery and our stocking policy are all paying dividends.

Most outstanding was the number of fish caught during the month of August, a total of 189 salmon in all, the highest return for the month in well over a decade.

'A' beat was one of the stars of the month and with a great record for the whole season. Despite being fished more lightly than other beats, ghillie John Anderson followed an excellent August in the previous year with the second highest return per rod days fished of any of our beats in 2008.

The success story continued with 'A' beat delivering the highest returns of all the Tulchan

beats in September - confirming it as an excellent "back-end" fishery.

Work on the river continues with the rebuilding of the battery at Lodge Stream on 'B' beat during 2008.

August and September display the Highlands in all their summer glory and, in the school holidays, offer the opportunity to introduce children and grandchildren - the next generation - to the excitement and art of the sport.

## ADVIE CHURCH JOINS ESTATE

Advie's picture postcard church has a new lease of life as part of the Tulchan Estate.

The parish church at Advie has long had close links with Tulchan. The current church, originally built in 1874, was largely restored by the McCorquodale family following the death of Edmund George McCorquodale in 1904.

The Litchfield family acquired the building and grounds in 2008 and, led by Gillian Litchfield, have undertaken a programme of restoration work which began last year with the renovation of the roof along with landscape and drainage works, all to safeguard the church for future generations.

Part of the parish of Cromdale and Advie (the two were united in 1969) the church has an illustrious history. King Edward VII worshipped here on his visits to the Estate and a roll of honour in the porch records the names of the

77 men of the parish who fought in World War One. The list is headed by Captain John Lockhart Wood DSO, one of sixteen from the parish who died during the conflict.

In 1939, Mrs Wood, his widow, established the Advie Church Trust - with the then considerable sum of £4000 - income from which was to be "applied to the maintenance of the church and manse, and of worship".

The church is open for community events and

provides the perfect setting for christenings and weddings.



#### 45 YEARS - AND THREE GENERATIONS!

### PHEASANT SHOOTING - A TEST FOR THE BEST GUNS

Considerable time and effort has been invested by headkeeper Les Mallinson and his team of beatkeepers over the course of the last few years in developing the established pheasant shoot at Tulchan.

New woodlands and strategically planted game crops have added a new dimension to the already highly acclaimed shoot, making the most of the spectacular topography to produce a driven shoot able to test the very best of guns.





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The 2008/09 season saw those efforts bear fruit with an extended shoot programme of 46 days from late October to the end of January producing consistently tall, testing pheasants in the most natural and beautiful of surroundings.

Drives such as Flagpole, Culdorachmore and Knocktulchan have established themselves amongst the best in the country. With the addition of new drives at The Gled and Culdrein, we are now able to drive pheasants for six consecutive days without repeat on a variety of ground from the edge of the heather hill to the bottom of Glenmore and the Tulchan Glen

All birds are reared from day-old chicks on our own game farm at Wester Culfoich under the watchful eye of manager Bryce Coutts, allowing us to ensure they are fully feathered and acclimatised prior to going to wood.

The pheasant shooting package includes coffee, elevenses and three course lunch and can be taken by the day or days with the option of fully catered accommodation at the Lodge or Knocktulchan to make it the highlight of any sporting calendar.
